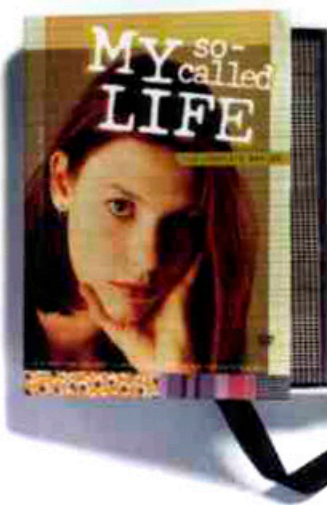


# The Honor Roll
